Unfortunately, cybercriminals are using the fear around the COVID-19 pandemic as an opportunity to scam and hack individuals. Please read below on ways to keep yourself protected and how to be aware of possible situations.

If at any time you suspect fraud on your account or debit card, lose or need to report your debit card stolen, please reach out to your financial organization.

E-mails

- Avoid opening emails and/or attachments from unknown senders.
- Delete all emails immediately that ask for your personal information such as account numbers, SSN, address, phone number, birthday, etc.

Watch out for emails from senders claiming they are from the Center For
Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) - DON'T click on any links or
open any attachments if they seem fishy. For the most up-to-date
information visit the cdc.gov and who.int websites directly.

If you've clicked on something you're afraid you shouldn't have, change your password immediately.

Phone Calls

- Don't ever provide any personal information over the phone.
- Be aware there are people trying to ask for money for fake donations. Do your homework before committing to any charities.

If anything feels unsettling at any time regarding your debit card or personal information, contact your financial organization.

Text Messages

• If the text or the sender is unfamiliar, don't respond - delete it right away.

Don't click on any suspicious links sent form unverified senders.
