## Business News Update May 18, 2020

I've been doing a lot of thinking over the weekend about the economy, and what the future will look like, as we slowly start opening and slowly get back to normal. It's so easy for everyone to order the things they need online. With that being said, I'm going to ask for a huge favor from everyone reading this email today. Whenever possible, please purchase your items from a Bricks & Mortar store. If you aren't able to do so, please order your products from companies that are located in the United States. Moving forward, if we can all do our very best to try and purchase local right here in Ashland, at the many many locally owned and operated businesses, that will help immensely with our local economy. This message of buying local and purchasing from bricks and mortar businesses, is going to a be a wide-spread campaign as we dig out of the economic trench this virus has left in our business communities throughout the county. I've always said, Ashland IS resilient and I don't think any differently now, we will get by and it may take some time, but if everyone can make a conscience decision to purchase a car or construction material, or clothing, etc. etc. here in town first, that would make the world of difference. These people are our neighbors and friends, and the first to be called upon to support the many non-profits in the community, baseball teams, benefits & fundraisers for those in need, and they are very

appreciative of the local support of the area residents.

We have been working with our area chambers, Washburn, Bayfield, & Madeline Island to join forces and promote the "Chequamegon Bay" this summer... Starting in July, we will start a soft push in Northwest Wisconsin & South-Central Minnesota areas to promote the water connection between the Chequamegon Bay Communities. The Local communities all know the "Chequamegon Bay" is the bay that connects Ashland, Washburn, Bayfield, and Madeline Island together and the gateway to the Apostle Islands, but our geographical markets don't connect Chequamegon Bay with Lake Superior and the Apostle Islands, so this became a great time to educate and introduce or brand this area as the "Chequamegon Bay" area rather than Lake Superior & Apostle Islands. The focus of our promotion is Outdoor Recreation; Fishing, Kayaking, Sailing, Boating, Swimming and you know there is ALWAYS Lodging, Shopping, and Dining!! The name of the promotion is "Water... Wander...Repeat". We wrote a Joint Effort Marketing Grant (JEM) through the State of Wisconsin Department of Tourism. This was one of the most competitive rounds they have ever seen. The State was really encouraging communities to work together to promote an area. They were able to modify some of the criteria, but we only had a short window of about 3 weeks to create the promotion and write the grant. There were 36 grant requests with only 20 funded. We were one of them and were awarded \$38,050. We have to match 25% of that and can use in-kind such as Public Relations, Design, Web Design, etc. etc., so will rely on the gifts of all of our office personnel to come up with the match and run a great campaign. Water sports tend to be organically social distancing, and we know from past surveys, that our visitors usually travel around the two-county area while they are staying in one of our destinations. The money will be used to promote the area through Billboards in the suburbs of the twin cities, television, digital & social media, Public Radio, and Print.

We should have the signage ready for those of you that are interested in just a day or so. We did make some changes to the verbiage and the message is Open & Ready! We'll have a short check list that your business is required to do and then you can hang that in your business. The same signage will be seen in Washburn, Bayfield, and Madeline Island. Any business that is agreeable to these steps can have a sign!! I'll keep you posted, and when they are ready, we will send them out in a pdf so

you can easily print them.

Well, well, no sign of any news from the south yet on any new changes or orders.... And, everything is kind of at a stand still in Washington as the new proposal was passed to the Senate, so basically. no drama to share with you today.
