UPDATED: CDC removes revised guidance on coronavirus transmission through the air

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) on Monday removed guidance it had posted on its website Friday that said airborne transmissions of the coronavirus were “thought to be the main way the virus spreads.” The CDC said that the guidance had been [posted in error](#). [President Trump](#) plans to announce his nominee to replace the late Justice [Ruth Bader Ginsburg](#) on the Supreme Court on Friday or Saturday, he said in an interview on “Fox & Friends” Monday morning. “I think it’ll be on Friday or Saturday,” Trump said when asked when he would announce his decision, adding that he wanted to “pay respect” to Ginsburg, who died Friday due to complications from pancreatic cancer, by waiting until after her funeral services. Gov. Evers Extends Mask Mandate for 60 Days

Gov. Tony Evers announced this morning that he has declared a new Public Health Emergency that shall remain in effect for the next 60 days. This essentially extends the Public Health Emergency that he declared in late July.

Along with declaring a new Public Health Emergency, the governor has also extended his mask mandate that requires most people age five and over wear a face covering when in an enclosed space. Gov. Evers' order reads:

Every individual, age five and older, in Wisconsin shall wear a face covering if both of the following apply:

- a. The individual is indoors or in an enclosed space, other than at a private residence; and;*
- b. Another person or persons who are not members of individual's household or living unit are present in the same room or enclosed space.*

Face coverings are strongly recommended in all other settings, including outdoors when it is not possible to maintain physical distancing.

The governor's order appears to be nearly identical to his initial mask mandate that went into effect this summer. Following Gov. Evers' initial order, WMC sent a letter to the Administration seeking clarification on portions of the order. In addition, WMC asked for some changes to the order, including that plastic face shields could be used instead of cloth face coverings, as these can be more safely used in some manufacturing and construction settings. Gov. Evers, his staff and agency heads who received the letter never responded.

WMC will continue to seek clarification from the Evers Administration and will update our members on any new details.

While there are still legal questions about the authority of the governor to declare multiple Public Health Emergencies for the same reason, WMC encourages all of our members to follow the order and CDC best practices until there is a binding court decision on the matter.
