December 2-3: In Cable, a major event is the Festival of Trees, which includes the Enchanted Forest Tour & Silent Auction that starts Friday night, 6:30-8 p.m. at Cable Community Centre and continues through Saturday nights closing, 6-7:30 p.m. Bid on items such as a fully decorated tree, gift

The Jingle Bell Winter Fun 3K Walk starts at 1 p.m. at St. Ann's Church parking lot, across from Cable Community Centre, with proceeds going to C.A.R.E.

At 5 p.m. in downtown Cable is the Love Lights Tree ceremony, then the Holiday Lighted Parade, which comes up Kavanaugh Road and turns onto Highway M to the UCC Church, where you can warm up with hot chocolate, cider and pictures with Santa. Participants record and count birds and bird species within 15-mile diameter circles in the Cable and Hayward area from dawn to dusk. Bird feeders within the circles are also surveyed, so feeder counters are needed.
